


Eagletail Mountains Wilderness

The Bureau of Land Management and the Arizona Game and Fish Department are coordinating efforts to redevelop two wildlife water catchments and potentially reintroduce a population of endangered Sonoran Pronghorn within the Eagletail Mountains Wilderness.

Scoping comments are accepted until tomorrow, May 15th.

San Pedro Riparian National Conservation Area

This NCA's resource management plan and travel management plan are being revised, and there's a lot at stake for this critically important desert stream. The BLM has just published [highlights of draft alternatives](#) – and we need your voice to support wilderness preservation in the following ways:

- Attend the BLM's next Public Meeting on Tuesday, May 19th, 6–8pm in Hereford (near Sierra Vista).
- Or, submit a comment by June 5th to David McIntyre: dmcintyre@blm.gov

We especially need to let the BLM know we want to see wilderness values ("Lands with Wilderness Characteristics") and ecological values preserved in this biodiversity hotspot that harbors hundreds of migratory birds, several threatened and endangered species, and extensive archaeological resources. A number of proposed projects could adversely impact the riparian corridor.

AWC has an outstanding lineup of Stewardship projects coming this year – and we need your help to secure funding for this great work! The National Forest Foundation has awarded AWC \$46,000 to complete restoration projects across the state, but we only receive the funds if we raise an equal amount of private matching funds. - Eradication of invasive tamarisk in the Apache Creek watershed
- Trail maintenance and sign installation to improve visitor experience in the Castle Creek Wilderness
- Restoration of native vegetation in the Pine Mountain Wilderness
